- > Quarantine for close contacts will not be required by the District. However, a parent may choose to keep their student home and monitor for symptoms.
- > Students/Staff who test positive for Covid-19 will need to stay home and isolate 10 days, be fever free for 24hrs, and show improvement with symptoms.
- Please stay in communication with the school so that we know when to expect your child back at school. PLEASE ALSO PROVIDE A COPY OF TEST RESULTS TO THE SCHOOL NURSE.
- ➤ It is the responsibility of the student to follow current **building level homework/make up policies** during their absence.
- > Encourage your child to get rest, stay hydrated, cover coughs, and wash hands.
- ➤ Call 911 or call ahead to the Emergency Department if you or your child experience trouble breathing, persistent pain or pressure in the chest, new confusion, the inability to wake or stay awake, or bluish lips or face.
